

What is an STNA?

A State Tested Nursing Assistant (STNA) is an essential part of the healthcare team. He or she is the hands-on care provider. This is the person who has the most daily contact with the resident. The STNA knows the resident better than any other member of the healthcare team

Job duties of the STNA include providing assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, eating, toileting, dressing and mobility.

The STNA provides valuable input to the decision makers on the healthcare team through his or her observation.

In other words...The STNA is the backbone of the long-term care industry

Why a Career as an STNA?

Overall employment of State Tested Nursing Assistants is projected to grow 18 percent between now and 2018, faster than the average for all occupations. This growth is in response to the long-term care needs of an increasing elderly population.

Financial pressures on hospitals to discharge patients as soon as possible should boost admissions to nursing care facilities. As a result, new jobs will be more numerous in nursing and residential care facilities than in hospitals, and growth will be especially strong in community care facilities for the elderly.

- ◆ Enroll and pay tuition (financial assistance may be available)
- ◆ Successfully complete the Training Program
- ◆ Pass the State Test following Nurse Aide Training

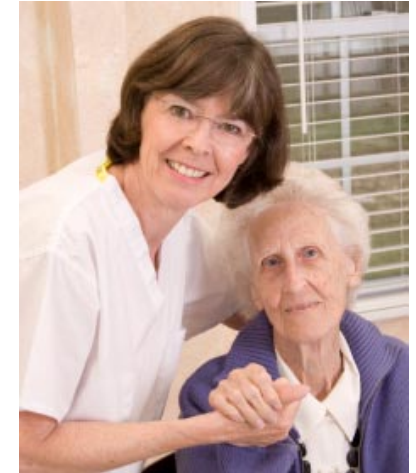
